

## Application for Students Attending Four- or Two- Year Schools

### 101: OVERVIEW AND SCHEDULE– 2019

#### **STUDENT ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS**

Students applying for a 101: award must:

- be graduating from Princeton High School (or be applying within one year of their PHS graduation)
- be accepted at a college, technical school, or vocational school
- meet financial eligibility requirements as determined by a financial aid expert reviewing applications along with the 101: Board

101: offers scholarships to those students demonstrating the most substantial need, to help cover some part of the tuition deficit they face. **All scholarships from 101: are sent directly to students' schools.**

As part of our review process, 101: asks for students' transcripts from the high school guidance department. Grades are not a factor in the awarding of scholarships, but we are interested in students' areas of study.

#### **TIMETABLE FOR DETERMINING STUDENT ELIGIBILITY**

**February 1** 101: Confidential Financial Statement are available to students and may be picked up from Mrs. Margaret Conway in the Princeton High School Guidance Office. This form, along with all required documents, must be completely filled out in order to apply for a 101: grant.

**April 8** Last day the forms may be turned in to Mrs. Conway in the Guidance Office. Students' applications will be forwarded to the Princeton University Financial Aid Office, where they will be reviewed to determine eligibility.

**Late May/ Early June** All applicants will be notified as to whether they will receive an award. Final decisions will be made after financial aid and scholarships from all other resources are known.

#### **INTERVIEWS**

In May, 101: Board members will meet with applicants to talk about the schools they hope to attend, summer plans, and any additional financial resources. In June, eligible students will be notified of the amount of their award from 101:

#### **PAYMENT SCHEDULE**

For those students awarded scholarships, a check for the award amount will be sent directly to the applicant's school, usually at the beginning of the fall semester.
